



1st KAS-DAAD Water sustainability and its impacts in human health



The first edition of the Kleine Alumni Seminars (KAS) on "Water sustainability and its importance in public health" is aimed at strengthening the important presence of the DAAD in Monterrey and aims to extend the activities of experts trained in Germany and special guests. The availability of quality water and its effects on human public health are priority areas for sustainable development at the global level, so it is necessary to strengthen multidisciplinary work teams that address this issue.

The objective of the event is to connect experts from the scientific community working with water resources management and health. The problem to be analyzed in the seminar is relevant because, at the global level, safe access to









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good quality water is a priority problem and is directly related to the deterioration of human health due to the consumption of poor quality water.

Water management in urban areas with large concentrations of inhabitants imposes enormous challenges in the access, supply, distribution, use and final disposal of water. If a population consumes poor water the health of the inhabitants can be seriously affected and critical scenarios can be presented depending on the number of people affected. The participation of experts from all over the country will allow attendees to better understand the context and the national reality on water issues. At the end of the event, it will seek to initiate cooperation ties between scientists and technologists in Mexico to form working groups that promote scientific and technological development in the area of water-health, this group research, development, and innovation must be oriented to seek and set up bilateral cooperation between Mexico and Germany.

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
